PROVINCETOWN -The Provincetown Tennessee Williams Theater Festival has announced that Felicia Hardison Londre, professor of theater at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, as the special guest scholar at the sixth annual Tennessee Williams Institute.

The University-level symposium is being offered during the festival from September 20-24.

Londre, who specializes in Shakespearean dramaturgy as well as 19th and 20th century American, French and Russian theater history, will provide a rich and valuable perspective for graduate student scholars enrolled in TWI.

Londre will attend performances alongside students, as well as lead and participate in discussions of this year's theme, Tennessee Williams and Shakespeare, in a workshop setting.

This year's festival will afford Londre the chance to study and discuss the intersections of Williams and Shakespeare plays in a week-long seminar environment.

Londre says that she has not previously had the opportunity to do this but anticipates some rich conversation.

In the intensely personal writing of Williams, tracking these themes is "complicated by the author's tendency to revise his writing over long periods of time," according to Londre.

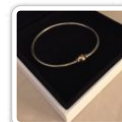

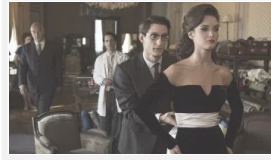
