Boat builders exhibit products at show

A selection of a large selection of unique, custom, limited-production sail and power boats in wood and fiberglass will be on display for the 13th annual Boat Builders Show in Hyannis. Cape Cod Maritime Museum also will be an exhibitor, and will educate attendees about the museum's recently designed and built Bevin's Jr., a 10-foot wooden skiff (a take on the original 12-ft. Bevin's Skiff) used to teach boat-building to middle-school students, and a Crosby 14-foot outboard skiff built at the museum. Show tickets include admission to the museum on Ocean Street.

Concert celebrates Buzzards Bay

Maestro Phil Sanborn will lead the Tri-County Symphonic Band in "Postcards From Buzzards Bay," celebrating the body of water shared by several towns. The concert gets its name from the premiere of a commissioned seven-movement work by Cape Cod composer Michael Donovan. Also featured will be other works written about the bay and about the sea, including a premiere by Rochester composer John Wallace and pieces by James Fulton, Francis McBeth, Robert Russell Bennett, Ralph Vaughan Williams and John Philip Sousa. The program is a collaborative effort of the Tri-County Music Association, the Buzzards Bay Coalition, Falmouth Academy, the Falmouth Art Center, the Marion Art Center and the Community Boating Center of New Bedford. A second concert will be held at 3 p.m. Sunday at Tabor Academy in Marion.
